I was excited to work with Zoey on her project for the New Music Ensemble: Film Score Edition in Fall, 2021. She had some ideas for a score for *Jinxy Jenkins & Lucky Lou*—a short animated film—and we were trying something new with the New Music Ensemble where we produced a concert of student and faculty film scores. We worked very hard over a short period of time (as is the norm for film score production) to produce a piece of music that fit the overall tone, had appropriate points of correspondence with the film, and was well-constructed in terms of the musical content and the orchestration. We took it to the ensemble, got a rough idea of what was working well and what wasn't, and did a whirlwind round of revision to produce an even stronger work. As the semester progressed, I helped Zoey with her conducting and rehearsal management (and also played one of the piano parts). The concert that featured her music (among others) was very successful and well-attended. I am proud of the work Zoey did with this film-score, and I was happy to have a hand in mentoring her through this process.
